As the Board of Trustees of the Wisconsin Laborers' Health Fund (the Fund or Plan), we are announcing changes to the cost-sharing for outpatient Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Treatment services under the Plan. The reconstructive breast surgery benefit is also being revised. Please read this Summary of Material Modification (SMM) in its entirety.

## Outpatient Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Cost Sharing Changes – Effective January 1, 2025

Effective January 1, 2025, the Plan will cover outpatient Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Treatment as follows:

The Mental Health Benefits and Substance Abuse Benefits Outpatient Treatment rows in the applicable Schedules of Benefits in your SPD are revised accordingly. Your deductible and other cost sharing under the Plan remain unchanged.

## Reconstructive Breast Surgery Following a Mastectomy – Effective January 1, 2025

Also effective January 1, 2025, the reconstructive breast surgery benefit on page 47 of your SPD is revised to read as follows:

Reconstructive surgery following a mastectomy. This includes reconstruction of the breast on which a mastectomy is performed, reconstructive surgery on the other breast to produce a symmetrical appearance, aesthetic flat closure, any necessary prostheses and surgical bras required as a result of a mastectomy, physical complications of any stage of mastectomy, including lymphedemas, and such other procedures as required under the Women's Health and Cancer Rights Act.
